To: All Supreme Officers, Present and Past; Worthy Grand Matrons and Worthy Grand Patrons, Present and Past; and Members of this esteemed Supreme Chapter Inc., Order of Eastern Star, U.S.A.:

Greetings to All Sisters and Brothers:

Best wishes to each of you for a Blessed and Happy New Year 2026.

We continue to pray for the good and welfare of all the Members and Grand Chapters that comprise our Supreme Chapter. Hold fast to your faith and trust in God. He will be with you through all things if you only believe.

WHEREAS: The President of the General Grand Masonic Congress, Ill. Bro. Warren L. Long, 33^o, recently released his proclamation regarding the 2026 Biennial Supreme Session. He has proclaimed July 9, 2026 through July 17, 2026, as the dates for the 104th Biennial Supreme Session of The General Grand Masonic Congress to be held at the Hilton St. Louis Airport, 10330 Natural Bridge Road, St. Louis, Missouri, 63134.

THEREFORE: By the power and authority in us vested as Supreme Matron and Supreme Patron of the Supreme Chapter Inc, Order of Eastern Star, U.S.A. set the above date for the 2026 Biennial Supreme Session to convene at the location designated by the President from Saturday, July 11, 2026 through Wednesday, July 15, 2026.

WHEREAS: This Proclamation requests the attendance of all Supreme Officers (elected and appointed), Past Supreme Matron, Sis. Jacquelyn Spires, Past Supreme Patron, Bro. Leonard Brown as well as all Honorary Supreme Matrons; Supreme Most Ancient Matron – Heroines of Jericho, Her. Rhonda E. Price; Supreme Grand Chief Counselor – Lady Knights, Lady Mary L. Gilbert; Supreme Most Worthy Grand Matron – Ancient Arabic Order of Daughters of Sphinx, Dtr. Mary L. Gilbert; Supreme Most Excellent Rose – Supreme College Rose of Seven Seals, Rose Tonia Pace and Supreme Queen, Sis. Juanita Dixon to assemble at this said session on the aforesaid dates. A seat will be reserved for you in the East at the ritualistic meetings. All elected Grand Matrons and Grand Patrons, state Grand Officers, Past Grand Matrons and Past Grand Patrons, all Worthy Matrons and Worthy Patrons, Present and Past and subordinate chapter members should register and attend the Supreme Session to support our organization, learn of its work and fellowship with its members.

BE IT KNOWN THAT: The official Headquarters for this session shall be The Hilton St. Louis Airport, 10330 Natural Bridge Road, St. Louis, Missouri 63134, (314) 426-5500. **Please make all reservations before May 31, 2026.** The room rates shall be \$135 per night for single or double occupancy. The current guestroom state sales tax rate is 19.34% which is subject to change and applicable to the room rate totaling \$161.11. Room rates are based on single or double occupancy. One night room deposit is required and is non-refundable. There is a \$100.00 incidentals deposit required; credit cards are most advisable or prepaid cards. Check -In Time/Check -Out Time: Check-in time is 3pm and check-out time is 12pm. Guests arriving before 3pm, will be accommodated as rooms become available. Front Desk Staff can arrange to check baggage for those arriving early when rooms are not available and for guests attending functions on their day of departure.

Late Check Out (Based upon availability)

- Charge: \$75 until 3pm
- Charge: 100% of room rate after 3pm

Early Departure

- Charge: One night’s room and tax

Requests for handicapped accessible rooms, should be made at the time of reservation. A non-refundable deposit equal to one night's stay is required to hold everyone’s reservation. A \$100 one-time incidental hold at check-in on each guest’s credit or debit card. If/when the \$100 has been used, another \$100 incidental hold will be made. If a guest reserves a guest room within the block and checks out prior to the guest's reserved checkout date, an early departure fee of equal to the balance of the stay will be charged to that guest's individual account. Guests wishing to avoid this fee **must** advise the Hotel at or before three (3) days prior to arrival. The Hotel will deduct any early departure fees that are collected from any amount you may owe as sleeping room attrition.

The hotel has complimentary roundtrip shuttle service from Lambert-St. Louis International Airport (24 hour per day). Self-parking will be complimentary, no valet parking. EV charging stations are also available. Every Brother and Sister is asked to be considerate of the time and effort that has been put forth to prepare for this session. Therefore, we are asking for the entire membership to use the selected Headquarters Hotel for their stay while in Missouri attending the session.

BE IT FURTHER KNOWN THAT: All sisters attending the 2026 Biennial Supreme Session are requested to pre-register with “**The Package**” rates. Those attending meetings of the upper houses are required to display all respective badges during the entire session. Late arrivals are not exempt from the full package price. Badges come with the full purchase of a package. **The registration package for this Supreme Session per individual is \$300.00** and includes the following:

- Grand Master’s and Grand Matron’s Luncheon - **Monday, July 13, 2026 (\$65.00)**
- All States Night Celebration – **Wednesday, July 24, 2024 (\$10.00)**
- Brother’s Registration Fee is **\$20**. Brothers must register with the Congress to attend the Supreme Chapter OES Session.

The deadline for package registration is **April 24, 2026**. Registration fees received after **April 24, 2026**, will be **Three Hundred and Fifty (\$350.00) dollars. No Exceptions**. Registrations are accepted from state grand chapters only. No registrations will be accepted on site. As is standard practice, registration fees are non-refundable. State Grand Matrons or secretaries may pick up the registration packages on Friday and Saturday, July 10-11, 2026, at a time and location designated by the Supreme Financial Secretary. Should you need extra tickets for individuals not a member of the Order for any of these events, please purchase them through the Supreme Secretary as part of your state registration package. The cost for each event ticket is listed above in the package price

Grand Chapter representation fees are due May 1, 2026. All taxes, representation fees and assessments must be paid prior to being seated at the Supreme Session. Grand Matrons, please work closely with your State Grand Secretary and the Supreme Secretary to ensure that all is in order before arrival in Missouri. At the Supreme Session the credential report will be read to confirm adequate representation from all states.

All registration fees, Grand Chapter representation fees and the completed forms should be sent to the **Supreme Secretary, Sis. Juanita Dixon, 8225 Hot Springs Drive N., Jacksonville, FL 32244**. Make all checks payable to Supreme Chapter Inc., O.E.S. Sis. Dixon will forward to State Grand Matrons all necessary forms with this proclamation. Grand Matrons please ensure that all state Mother Advisors work with the youth through the duration of their session dates and are registered members of the Supreme Session. They, too, should have a badge that acknowledges them as a member of the Supreme Chapter and are required to be displayed to attend the Supreme Sunbeam Session. Therefore, those members staying only for the weekend, Grand Matrons, please inform the Supreme Secretary before their arrival. We understand the commitment level required to supervise our children and appreciate the dedication of all our Mother Advisors.

BE IT FURTHER KNOWN THAT: The General Grand Masonic Congress will publish a Fraternal Directory and a Souvenir Journal. Each Grand Chapter, each Grand Matron, each Cognate Branch of the Order of Eastern Star - Grand and Subordinate chapter is requested to participate in the Directory by sharing a list of your elected officers. **The cost of the Fraternal Directory ad is \$100 per page. Deadline for submission of ads is May 31, 2026. A Souvenir Journal Advertisement Agreement is included with this proclamation. The deadline for participation in the Souvenir Journal is July 1, 2026.** Pages for these publications must be pre-paid before they go to print. Only books paid for will be available in Missouri. Books purchased outside of the package will cost \$10.00. **Submissions along with payment are to be forwarded to Rev. Brother Norman C. Email is strongly encouraged, and funds can be mailed directly to the address above.**

BE IT FUTHER KNOWN THAT: The events for the 2026 Biennial Supreme Chapter Session are included within this Proclamation along with a tentative agenda for the Supreme Chapter Session. Please govern yourselves accordingly. We will strive to be considerate of our time and productively conduct our meeting in a timely manner.

BE IT ALSO KNOWN THAT: The use of recording and photographic devices during the Biennial Session will not be permitted without the expressed written permission of the President of the Congress or Supreme Matron. Recording devices, however, can be used for special events open to the public, such as Thanksgiving Service, Grand Master's/Grand Matron's Luncheon, Banquets, etc. Please be reminded of the guidelines about posting pictures; written permission of everyone in each photo must be obtained and is neither transferable nor inclusive for any photo.

WHEREAS: A **Ritualistic workshop** will be held on **Saturday, July 11, 2026** – Sis. Tonia Burrell Pace, 1st Assoc. Supreme Matron, Bro. Bryant Turner, Supreme Patron and the Supreme Deputies will lead the workshop. Information regarding the workshop will be shared at a later date. Please encourage your members to be in attendance. Uniforms/regalia are not required, no pants. We will conclude in time to attend the youth luncheon.

WHEREAS: Our **Supreme Youth Department** under the leadership of Sis. Vivian Hunter, Supreme Mother Advisor, will be in session during the period **July 10-12, 2026**, with a luncheon open to all Supreme participants on **Saturday, July 11, 2026**, and concluding on **Monday, July 12, 2026**, with a visit to the Supreme Chapter in session. Room reservations for this division of our organization should also be at the Headquarters location. Grand Matrons please encourage your membership to support your Grand Circles. Sisters and Brothers, please plan to attend the Supreme Youth Luncheon to show your support for the youth, learn of the young people's work and celebrate their accomplishments. Further information on the Supreme Youth Session and activities will be forthcoming from the Supreme Mother Advisor. Please adhere to the deadlines stated.

BE IT FURTHER KNOWN THAT: A **Divine Thanksgiving service** on **Sunday, July 12, 2026**, will begin at **12 noon**. Your attendance is requested. During this service a local male and female from the host state will be awarded the General Grand Masonic Congress and Supreme Chapter Humanitarian Award for their services to the community. In addition, the Pool Patterson Charity Award will be presented during this program. The Supreme Trailmasters and Sunbeams are requested to serve as ushers at the service.

BE IT FURTHER KNOWN THAT: The Order of Eastern Star is known and recognized as a charitable not for profit organization making a difference in their communities and in the lives of its members. Therefore, we are desirous of continuing the practice that **each** state delegation come to the 2026 Biennial Session prepared to share non-perishable items to be given to a charitable organization in the host state during our Thanksgiving Service. These contributions can be purchased upon your arrival. Grand Matrons, please work with the Grand Master of your state to manage this process for your state.

BE IT FURTHER KNOWN THAT: The **Grand Master's and Grand Matron's Luncheon** on **Monday, July 13, 2026** will be a **combined event**. We will continue to celebrate the invaluable leadership of Worthy

Grand Matrons. A leadership award to recognize a Grand Matron that has provided exemplary and outstanding service to and through their Grand Chapter during the past two years will be presented. Grand Chapters may submit a nomination and a brief resume explaining why their nominee is qualified for the award, i.e. service to the grand chapter and its members, community and charitable activities initiated and sponsored by the grand chapter under her leadership. The nomination must be approved by the Grand Chapter and bear the signature of a Past Grand Matron, Grand Patron and the Grand Secretary. A committee will be established to review the nominations and make a recommendation. The decision of the committee shall be final. Nominations must be submitted to the Supreme Matron by **June 1, 2026**. Additionally, two Grand Matrons (one from a small state and one from a large state) with the most delegates attending the luncheon will receive an award.

BE IT FURTHER KNOWN THAT: All sisters in good standing with their Grand Chapter and their Grand Chapter in good standing with the Supreme Chapter may attend the Session. Only members of the Grand Chapter's Official Delegation are entitled to vote according to the Supreme Bylaws. **Supreme Chapter Delegates are present and past Supreme Matrons and Patrons, present and past Worthy Grand Matrons and Worthy Grand Patrons, present and past Worthy Matrons and Worthy Patrons and must have been elected in Grand and Subordinate Chapters, respectively by majority vote.** Male delegates must be registered with the Congress and display both badges. Brothers must register with a \$20.00 fee to the Supreme Chapter.

WHEREAS: The Supreme officer's dress code for all female elected officers shall be long white robes, including the Board of Directors. All other officers and delegates (female) will adhere to the By-laws and wear long plain white dresses (**gowns**), one-piece, long sleeves, no splits or low neckline and no black under garments. The exception to this requirement applies to the officers that wear the floral colors, floral stars-Adah, Ruth, Martha, and Electa. All other members will dress in the standard uniform of the Order. All sisters shall wear closed-toed white shoes (low heels or flats), the Floral Stars may wear shoes of their floral color. Jewelry should consist of the basic, small pearl earrings, **no nose or body piercing**. Cellular earpieces **are not** a prescribed complement to our regalia. Body paint images should not be displayed while in regalia. **Remember:** Small white pearl earrings apply to all. Please alert the 1st Assoc. Supreme Matron of any health concerns that will refrain you from adhering to the Supreme guidelines. Facemasks may be worn in all group settings. Brothers shall wear Masonic attire with Order of Eastern Apron.

BE IT KNOWN THAT: The appropriate dress/attire for scheduled events are as follows:

- Thanksgiving Service-----Full regalia
- Sunday Dinner -----Business Casual
- Supreme Chapter Session-----Full regalia
- Sunbeam Session-----Full regalia
- Sunbeam-Trailmasters Luncheon-----Business Casual – **No pants**
- Black and White Ball-----Semiformal – Black and White or Black – **No pants**
- Grand Masters and Matrons Luncheon-----Full regalia
- All States Night-----Casual

The hosts of the Prayer Breakfast and State Night events will share more details directly with the states under separate cover.

BE IT FURTHER KNOWN THAT: The General Grand Masonic Congress will sponsor a “10 for 10” Fundraiser Giveaway and request the participation of the Supreme Chapter. Each Grand Chapter will receive an allotment of giveaway tickets under separate cover. Ticket price is \$10 each.

BE IT FURTHER KNOWN THAT: The business of this Supreme Chapter Session for the Order of Eastern Star will include the work of committees and activities as stated in this proclamation. Grand Matrons, please be prepared to submit names for various committees when requested by the Supreme Matron. It is the responsibility of all committee chairpersons to report the names of assigned members, submit vouchers, and return committee reports to the Supreme Secretary. In addition, all committee books and reports should be ready by the beginning of Monday’s opening session. This means that all chairpersons should pick up their books from the Supreme Secretary no later than Saturday, July 11th and meet with their committees. A copy of all reports should be submitted to the Supreme Secretary and Supreme Matron before they are read to the body.

Committees:

Grand Chapter Representation and Credentials:

WHEREAS: The Supreme Chapter must maintain proper and accurate records of all state funds submitted to the Supreme. All Grand Matrons will report pertinent information on the proper forms provided by the Supreme Secretary, Sis. Juanita Dixon. Any submissions sent via **overnight mail** require prior notification to the Supreme Secretary. Forms can be duplicated in order to keep a copy for your record. Please return the original copy.

The information that is reported by the Grand Chapters will show the status of the Supreme Chapter. To ensure that this information is accurate, Grand Matrons please work with your secretaries to report the following membership data: new, affiliated, deceased, reinstated, and active members of your state. Please be reminded that each Grand Chapter must have a minimum of three subordinate chapters composed of at least seven female members to maintain a Grand Chapter Charter. To support the report, please attach a copy of your full membership roster by chapter. Having the names of all members supports the accuracy of the financial details. If there are difficulties completing the report, please contact the Supreme Secretary, Sis. Juanita Dixon.

Popularity Committee- Sis. Linda Smith, 2nd Assoc. Supreme Matron, Chairperson

WHEREAS: All states are asked to encourage someone to compete for the **Supreme Queen**. It is a very rewarding experience to represent your state and gain national recognition for positive charitable work. All contestants must be registered members at the biennial session. Each state that does not have a queen contestant is required to submit \$100.00 for this activity to the Popularity Committee Chairperson not to

the Supreme Secretary. The Supreme Queen will be crowned at the Supreme Biennial Session. These funds will be used for the work of the Order. The chairperson has been instructed to strictly adhere to the rules of the competition. The 2nd Assoc. Supreme Matron will send a separate correspondence to each state Grand Matron.

Scholarship Screening Committee – Sis. Laquita Louie, Chairperson

BE IT FURTHER KNOWN THAT: This committee selects the recipient of the Etta Brisbane Isaac Scholarship. Each state can submit one (1) applicant for the scholarship. The committee will determine the recipient from applications received by the deadline and rules that are in place. A copy of the scholarship application and guidelines will be mailed to all state Grand Chapters. Please advise your students of the importance of following the exact directions on the application. Deadline dates must be complied with. All **applications** should be sent to **Sis. Laquita Louie, Supreme Chairperson, Etta Brisbane-Isaac Scholarship Committee, 8050 S Throop, Chicago, Illinois, 60620**. Each state is assessed \$200 for the Etta Brisbane-Isaac Scholarship Program which should be sent to the **Supreme Secretary**. The scholarship recipient will be announced during the Supreme Chapter Session.

BE IT FURTHER KNOWN THAT: The committee has reviewed all suggested changes to the Supreme By-laws that were submitted at the 2024 Supreme Session. These changes will be voted on during the Supreme Chapter Session.

Fraternal Star- Sis. Ashley Williams, Supreme Recorder, Chairperson

BE IT FURTHER KNOWN THAT: The Fraternal Star is our medium for sharing charitable and benevolent activities performed by our grand chapters during the past two years. Grand Matrons, please select a member from your state to serve on this committee and submit their name and contact information to the committee chairperson and the Supreme Matron. The deadline for submissions is June 13, 2026. **Material received after the submission deadline will not be included in this publication.**

Poole-Patterson Charity

BE IT FURTHER KNOWN THAT: Funds collected for the Poole Patterson Charity will be donated to support a charity in the host state and/or a Supreme designated National charitable organization. Each Grand Chapter is assessed \$200.00 for this activity in lieu of selling give-away tickets. This assessment should be submitted to the Supreme Secretary. The funds received will be reported in the Supreme Chapter session as well as the recommended recipient charitable organization.

Retirement Fund

BE IT FURTHER KNOWN THAT: This Fund was established to provide support for our retired Past Supreme Matrons and Past Supreme Patrons. Each state is assessed \$100.00 toward this Fund which should be submitted to the Supreme Secretary as part of their representation fee. Funds received will be reported in the session.

BE IT ALSO KNOWN: In any public gathering, there is an inherent risk of exposure to COVID-19. The health and safety of our Brothers, Sisters and guests are a top priority.
